Design Concept & Process:

In April of 1998, I visited a famous rhododendron garden on Whidby Island in Puget Sound. The gardens were in full bloom with rhododendrons of every color. The landscape was magnificent, but I discovered that there was a landscape of beauty and energy inside each individual blossom. This is my interpretation of one of the blossoms I photographed that day.

The design process began with a photograph of a rhododendron blossom which I took with a macro lens. I made a black and white drawing of the flower with shading, to emphasize the contours of the ruffled petals.

I translated this drawing to a simple line drawing, with separate shapes defining the shaded areas. I scanned this drawing into my computer and experimented with various arrangements of color and value.

When I felt I was ready to begin the quilt, I printed out the color study I liked the best, to use as a general guide. The line drawing was

enlarged, using an overhead projector. The large paper drawing was cut up into individual pieces, which were used as templates for cutting the fabric. My intention was to capture the beauty and energy of the blossom without making a photorealistic reproduction.

The quilt is pieced and appliqued with a series of yellows, peaches and pinks, painted and dyed in a gradation of values. The background is pieced from a variety of fabrics painted in shades of green and brown. The quilting pattern is similar to the patterns found in the veins running through flower petals and leaves.

The center panel is surrounded by a 1" border of black, followed by a multicolored painted binding.


The back of the quilt is made from a single multicolored piece of painted cotton sheeting, surrounded by a 1" black border.
